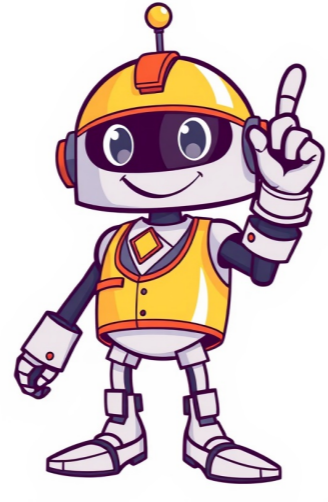

In keeping with the Orgrill knives, I'm also going to have Bill scrim a matching mammoth ivory plaque with the entire Cabanel "Birth of Venus" image (including all the cherubs). The plaque may have to be a bit bigger than the Orgrill ones (to fit the whole image) but that's not necessarily a bad thing. Here are the mock-ups I made.
