Try to minimise these when storing your Playmobil. This was helpful (1855) Read more Lego advises to clean the bricks by hand with some water (no warmer than 40°C) and a mild detergent. Never place the bricks in a washing machine or dishwasher. Let the bricks air-dry afterwards. Electric parts can only be cleaned with dry cloth. Building a custom mech using MyBuild Mecha Frames and LEGO® sets can be a fun and creative experience for all the AFOLs and. Let's get started on designing a hybrid mech, which puts Gundam Wing to shame using some simple Amazon products below: Steps to Build Your Custom Mech: Begin with the MyBuild Mecha Frame MF5 Mech Frame or MyBuild Mecha Frame 1001 Basic Frame Model as your base. Both of these products provide a sturdy base with articulation and they are LEGO® compatible, making them ideal for building custom mechs. I have had zero issues putting other LEGO® compatible or genuine LEGO® pieces on these frames. Also, I know these are not made with ABS plastic, but whatever plastic they are made out of is sturdy enough! Use the MyBuild cockpit chassis cabin piece to fit a LEGO® minifig. You can choose a minifigure from any theme, as long as it fits the build you like! I used the LEGO® Boba Fett Mech modeling to help me craft a cockpit. Also, I found the Black Panther LEGO® mech to be helpful as well. I highly recommend looking online at MOCs and Google, "Custom LEGO® Mechs" for inspiration! The AFOL community always has exceptional ideas for you to base your build and display on. From the LEGO® Marvel Iron Man Monger 76190 Use the pieces meant for the Monger's armor and weaponry to augment your mech. This will give the mech a bulky and formidable look. Consider using the arm and leg pieces to enhance the silhouette and increase the mech's overall height. Implement decorative and functional pieces, such as boosters, missile launchers, or decorative armor plating. From the LEGO® Marvel The Hulkbuster 76247: Use the Hulkbuster's chunky armor pieces to give the mech a heavily fortified appearance. Especially, the torso and arms can be integrated to give a beefy and armored appearance. Utilize the Hulkbuster's fists as the mech's primary hand or as a weapon attachment. Add the detailed components like smaller thrusters, chest arc reactor, and shoulder-mounted weaponry to the mech for added firepower. Using the articulation provided by the MyBuild Mecha Frame, ensure that your additional armor pieces don't hinder movement. You want your mech to be as poseable as possible. Ensure that if you give this build gauntlets or longer pieces that overlay, they don't clip the frame and fall off when you pose the mech MOC. Use weapons and accessory pieces from both the LEGO® sets to equip your mech with unique tools. This can be anything from handheld weapons to mounted guns or missile systems. The Boba Fett Mech blaster was a huge source of inspiration for me here! They are really expensive, but Bionicle parts and pieces rock here, too, if you have them in a drawer somewhere. Once you're satisfied with the basic structure, fine-tune the look. Use smaller LEGO® pieces to fill any gaps and create a seamless appearance. I used the LEGO® Black Panther silver pieces to give one of my custom MOCs scales and armor. Test the LEGO® mech's articulation and balance to make sure it stands properly and can strike various poses without any pieces falling off. Also, you can use the display LEGO® stands from the CMF series to place under each foot to ensure it stays standing. Showcase your custom mech alongside your other LEGO® and MyBuild LEGO®-compatible creations. Heck, you can even display it next to other anime mechs or models. Or, use it for imaginative play scenarios involving Iron Man, Hulkbuster, and other Marvel characters. Tips For Building Your Mech: Don't be afraid to combine themes and look for inspiration. I always build custom mechs with a design or picture in mind from something that exists in another creative work. Ensure your mech can stand on its own for a great pose on your shelf by using LEGO® plates under the "feet" of the mech. Don't make the make too top heavy or it won't stand! Take your time and happy building!
