Who needs a driver's license to drive in New York State? All drivers must have a valid New York State driver's license to operate a vehicle on state roadways. Non-residents with a valid driver license from another state or nation can lawfully drive in New York State. Minors under 16 are not allowed to drive, even if they have a valid driver's license from another state. New residents who've moved to New York State must surrender their out-of-state driver's license and apply for a New York State driver's license within 30 days of moving. Residents must notify the DMV of any address change within ten days of the occurrence under New York State law. You must be at least 16 years old to get a learner permit or driver license in New York State. Before taking your road test, you'll need to practice driving under the supervision of a licensed driver and complete either a pre-licensing course or a driver education course. Undocumented immigrants can apply for a New York State driver's license by swearing they don't have a Social Security Number and providing other required documents. Suspensions/revocations occur due to alcohol/drug offenses, speeding, uninsured vehicles, and more. Driving during suspension is against the law.
