## Replacement Title

**Replacement Title** is a process by which a duplicate title is issued for a vehicle whose original title is lost, stolen, damaged, or otherwise unavailable. This process is necessary when the original title is not available for any reason, such as the title being held by a third party, the title being destroyed, or the title being held by a third party who is not the registered owner. The process involves providing proof of ownership, such as a bill of sale, a lien release, or a power of attorney, and paying a fee to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC). The MVC will then issue a duplicate title to the registered owner. The process is outlined in the [Replacement Title](#) section of the MVC website.

Defined as: The most common procedure for acquiring a duplicate title showing the current information existing on the New Jersey MV system. This is only necessary when the physical title is unavailable. If a title is available, but damaged, the procedure is called 'replacement' title. Ask NJ CAR Title Services staff for instructions if this applies to your situation. Required Paperwork: Proof of ownership in the form of a New Jersey insurance card or registration card showing the connection of the owner to the Vehicle Identification number. The card(s) may be current or expired. OS/SS-52 Application for Duplicate Title Form Lien Release or a Letter of Authorization from lienholder allowing a duplicate title to be issued. Authorization Letter signed by the titled owner allowing a duplicate title to be issued. Proof of payoff is required if the vehicle is within 5 model years. The Exceptions: In cases where proof of ownership isn't available, request the alternate directions from Title Services staff. When an out-of-state resident is applying for a New Jersey title, additional information is required. Below is a procedure checklist for requesting a duplicate title with proof of ownership. Checklist for Duplicate Title with Proof of Ownership There are various situations that may require you to request a duplicate title. The best way to do so is to get an appointment to visit a motor vehicle agency. In some situations, you may be able to request one by mail, but that can take 8-12 weeks. Questions, contact us. If the vehicle is leased/financed, you must have all of the above documentation, plus a statement from the current/past lien holder that includes the following: Owner's name, Make, year, and the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN), and a Signed statement from the representative submitting the letter on behalf of the lien holder, declaring that the original title is not in their possession. \*NOTE: A duplicate title issued with a lien will be mailed to the lien holder. Replacement Title Fees for lost and damaged titles are regulated by law. A fine may be imposed if the individual who applies for a duplicate title knowingly has the original title. Schedule an appointment at a Vehicle Center, complete the Universal Title Application (form OS/SS-UTA) – available online and at motor vehicle agencies. Provide a current or expired registration, proof of insurance or a certified registration record. Bring original title (if damaged). There is a \$60 fee. Duplicate Title Requirements for Out of State Residents Instructions to request a duplicate title under this circumstance are contained in OS/SS129. Duplicate title - Financial Institution If your company has changed names since the original title was processed and the MVC's database is not yet updated you cannot complete the request. You can call the MVC's Business License Services unit at 609-292-6500 ext. 5014 to check the status. Complete the Universal Title Application (form OS/SS-UTA) – available online and at motor vehicle agencies. Provide a Power of Attorney (POA) granting permission for the company's representative to sign on behalf of the financing institution. Required, along with a copy of the representative's valid photo ID provide a copy of the financing contract, current or expired registration, proof of insurance or a certified registration record. If the lienholder is applying for a duplicate themselves, without a POA from the owner we require a copy of the contract/security agreement. No other proof of ownership is acceptable in these specific cases. The \$60 fee was not included in the package. Proof of ownership was not included in the package.

Acceptable proof is a current or expired registration and/or insurance card. A copy of the driver's license is required for all of the vehicle owners. An incomplete Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) was provided. You should check all forms prior to visiting a motor vehicle agency or submitting via mail to ensure that all are complete and any additional documentation is included. Available Methods for Replacing Your Car Title in New Jersey The currently available methods for submitting a New Jersey replacement car title request are in person and via mail. Applicants who decide to replace a lost car title in person will be required to visit a nearby NJ motor vehicle agency to surrender the applicable paperwork to an MVC employee. If unable to replace their lost car title in person at a title office, vehicle owners may submit all the required documents via mail to the Motor Vehicle Commission. Currently, there is no way to replace a car title online. By Mail If you wish to successfully replace a car title by mail in NJ, then ensure you have all the required paperwork ready for submission. Note that your application package for replacing a vehicle title will depend on your circumstances. Also, when submitting your replacement title application form via mail do not include cash, as this is not an acceptable form of payment for mail-in requests. If your application form for an NJ lost car title replacement is not filled out completely and correctly and the supporting documents are not submitted, then the Motor Vehicle Commission has the authority to reject your request. In Person The process to replace a lost car title in person at a title office is always an available option for motor vehicle owners who are not able to send their replacement application via mail. The New Jersey requirements for replacing a lost or damaged car title at a motor vehicle agency are similar to those that apply to mail-in replacements. Before going to a local branch to replace a lost auto title at the DMV, applicants must make sure that they have the required documents on hand and that they are able to pay the set duplicate price. Motorists who present an incomplete application package may have their request for a car title search and duplicate copy rejected.
