He had grown up in a loving family, that was never in question. But he never knew who his biological father was. And over time it began to eat away at him. "My mother met my father when he was a soldier and stationed at Ft. Bliss in El Paso, Texas," the 32-year-old Savanna, Ga. resident said. "She had a relationship with him but he moved on before she knew she was pregnant, so he never knew I existed." When Milan finally launched a serious effort to track down his real father he enlisted the help of Spokeo, a Pasadena-based search engine that organizes White Page listings, public records and social media information into easily searchable online profiles to help users quickly find people. "Spokeo allowed me to cross-reference a lot of loose ends," said Milan, who works as a real estate agent. "They offered the largest amount of public information - more than any other medium we were using." And it paid off. Last year Milan connected with his biological father, who lives just four hours away in North Carolina. "Now I just have a sense of fulfillment, that's the easiest way to sum it up," he said.
