To obtain a Florida driver's license, you need to provide proof of identity, Social Security number, and residential address. You must also pass a vision and hearing test, complete a Traffic Law and Substance Abuse Education course, and pass the driving skills test. If under 18, parental consent is required. Non-U.S. citizens must provide valid immigration documents. In Florida, the cost to acquire a new Class E (auto) driver's license is \$48. If you need to take the knowledge test, there's an additional \$10 fee. For commercial driver's licenses (Class A, B, or C), fees range from \$75 to \$81. Collapse all Who Needs a Florida license? Driver's licenses issued by the state of Florida are required for anyone who wants to operate a motor vehicle on public roads and highways in the state. Who is considered a resident of Florida? You are considered a resident of Florida if you: spend more than six months in Florida at a time, become a registered voter in Florida, teenagers attend a public school, citizens who accept a job offer submit an application for a homestead tax break. I just moved to Florida and have a valid license from another state. What do I need to do? After moving to Florida, you have 30 days to get a driver's license. I am a non-resident and have a valid non-commercial driver license from another state. Do I need a Florida driver license? A valid driver's license from another state or territory in the United States is sufficient for non-residents to drive in Florida. I am a non-resident and have a valid non-commercial driver license from another country. Do I need a Florida license? There is no need for a Florida driver's license for non-residents who have an International Driving Permit from their home country and a valid license from their home country. When a trainee driver is in the front passenger seat, they must be accompanied at all times by a licensed driver over the age of 21. First-time drivers are restricted to driving only in daylight for the first three months after receiving their license. How much does a replacement license cost? There is a \$25 charge for a new license. As long as the card hasn't been altered, the replacement price is waived if the card was stolen and a copy of the police report is provided. If you've held a learner's license for at least 12 months or until you are 18, you may apply for a driver's license. A learner's permit cannot be issued to someone who has had a traffic offense conviction within the last year. The completion of an authorized motorcycle safety course is a must. I am over 18.
